

Today, the City of New Orleans, built by 50 different African nations, is 298 years old. The struggle for complete liberation by people of African descent has always been abreast, especially after the founding of New Orleans in 1718. The tour acquaints you with an overview of greater Black New Orleans today. We highlight and showcase the life and struggle of the people. The attractions include golf courses, schools, universities, neighborhoods, artists, music and cuisine. See the Homer A. Plessy marker-site where Plessy resisted and was arrested for defying Louisiana's state law that segregated railroad trains based on race which led to the 'separate but equal' law of the

land; City of New Orleans Golf Course, where Blacks were only allowed to play one day during the week, former John McDonogh #19 Elementary School and William Frantz Elementary School where four six-year-old Black girls sought the right to attend a public school, Ellis Marsalis Musical Center. St. James A.M.E. Church where former enslaved men were mustered into the Union Army to fight for their freedom during the Civil War, visit Central City where progressive and militant organizations were once headguartered.
